Caucus Rules

1. Each caucus will be run by a District Officer and will have in attendance at least one Sergeant-At-Arms.
2. Candidates cannot produce or distribute campaign materials at convention. Instead, all candidates for the offices of Governor, Secretary and Lieutenant Governor may produce a one page Biographical Sketch that will be published and distributed to all Voting Delegates.
3. Candidates will be given the attention of the assembled delegates and should be given sufficient time to answer a question before answering another. A period of 3 minutes will be allowed in order that each candidate can give the caucus his or her speech. There will be a maximum period of 2 minutes in which questions may be asked.
4. Physical contact, hazing, questions pertaining to race, sex, religion, or any other any other questions unbecoming of a Key Clubber are prohibited. All questions are subject to the approval of the presiding officer. Candidates should be quizzed on their knowledge of the mission, vision, and core values of the organization.
5. Pre-approved questions for caucusing are included in the Convention Candidates packet.
6. Questions will be conducted in an orderly fashion with the officer in charge responsible for the method of recognizing the questioner from the floor.
7. No more than one candidate may be present in a caucus at one time
8. Adults are not permitted to question or comment on candidates. All adults, with the exception of a designated adult administrator, must remain at the rear of the room.
9. All members of a region must be in attendance at their assigned caucus. All members of a caucus must be visible at all times to the candidate. No member of a caucus shall be within three feet of a candidate at any time, with the exception of the presiding officer, timer, and sergeant-at-arms.
10. No caucus may make a bidding obligation on a candidate that is to be enforced outside the caucus.
11. No sound devices or distracting objects of any kind are allowed in the caucus rooms with the exception of a timer for the time keeper.
12. The caucus rooms will be left the same way that they were found. No one will be dismissed until the room has been put back in order.
13. No one is allowed to enter a caucus during candidates' remarks.
14. Any individual not following these rules will be considered in violation of the convention rules and will be therefore subject to appropriate disciplinary action.

Election Rules

1. All District Officers with the exception of the District Bulletin Editor / Webmaster will be elected at the District Convention.
2. The official program of the District Convention shall indicate the days and hours for nominations and the election of officers. This will be subject to change only with the rules of Convention procedure.
3. The District Board of Trustees shall determine the members of the Committee on Elections and Committee on Credentials.
4. Each candidate for office is required to submit a biographical sketch. Those candidates submitting their biographical sketches to the Chair of the Elections Committee thirty (30) days prior to the Opening Session of District Convention will have their biographical sketches published by the District and submitted to the delegates. The Chair of the Elections Committee shall publish the candidates' biographical sketches publication by office.
5. The names of candidates will be taken when the Convention program dictates it is time to receive nominations from the floor for all offices to be filled at District Convention.
6. The Nominating Conference will be comprised of four (4) delegates of each region with no more than one (1) representative per Key Club. Delegates to the Nominating Conference are elected during the regional caucuses of the District Convention.
7. The District Governor shall designate a member of the District Board of Trustees, with the District Administrator's approval, as Chairperson of the Nominating Conference. Only the Chairperson of the Nominating Conference, the delegates to the Conference, the District Administrator, and Kiwanis guests shall be permitted to attend and observe the proceedings of the Nominating Conference.
8. The Chairperson shall select a member of the Conference as secretary for the Nominating Conference. Two-thirds (2/3) of the members present at the Conference will constitute a quorum.
9. Upon completion of the organization as outlined above, the Nominating Conference shall proceed to select candidates for the District Governor, District Secretary, and Lieutenant Governor positions to be submitted to the House of Delegates. The Conference shall elect no more than two (2) candidates for said positions from the nominations made at the District Convention.
10. Each candidate for office will be allowed a minimum of three (3) minutes to speak at the Nominating Conference. No candidate for office shall be present within the Conference when any other candidate for the same office speaks.
11. Candidates for the offices of District Governor and District Secretary may apply to the Nominating Conference for dual nomination as a Lieutenant Governor. Dual nomination is only allowed as approved by the Nominating Conference.
12. The Chairperson of the Nominating Conference shall submit an accurate report of the outcome of the Conference to the District Secretary who shall hold it until the end of the Convention. The District Secretary shall post the outcome of the Nominating Conference.
13. Before the opening of the polls, the Chair of the Credentials Committee shall certify the number of delegates.
14. No ballot will be counted upon which the elector has voted for a greater or a lesser number of nominees than there are vacancies for said office.
15. Pre-arranged voting and voting by proxy will not be permitted.
16. The Committee on Elections will report the results of the balloting at the last banquet of the District Convention. The District Administrator shall keep all ballots for a period of ninety (90) days after the close of the Convention, whereupon the ballots will be destroyed.
17. Candidates for the positions of District Governor and District Secretary must attend all regional caucuses. Lieutenant Governors will be elected only by their regions.
18. All delegates will be excluded from all candidacy voting in the House of Delegates if they are absent from any caucusing in their designated regions.

Code of Conduct

1. No Key Clubber will be permitted to leave the hotel grounds for any purpose until the close of the convention.
2. No Key Clubber will be allowed to charge any expense. All Key Clubbers must pay cash for hotel expenses.
3. No Key Clubber will be permitted to consume or possess an intoxicating beverage, including beer or wine. This rule applies to all Key Clubbers regardless of age, as well as guests below the age of 21. If alcoholic beverages are found in a room all Key Clubbers or persons in that room at the time may be held responsible for a violation of these rules.
4. This same rule applies to the use of any drug, narcotic, or controlled substance except for prescribed medicine.
5. Defacing of any property of throwing of any objects from windows or balconies is prohibited.
6. The Sergeant-At-Arms Committee, which includes the District Board, is authorized to confiscate any materials causing, or likely to cause a disturbance to the orderly procedure of the convention. All persons attending the convention will be expected to cooperate with and respect the authority of the Sergeant-At-Arms Committee at all times.
7. No Key Clubbers will be allowed to have fireworks.
8. At 12:00 am curfew will be observed and enforced. All chaperones shall make sure that those Key Clubbers for whom they have assumed responsibility are in their assigned rooms at curfew. Unnecessary noises at any hour are prohibited.
9. All convention attendees must reside within the room to which they are registered.
10. No Key Clubber will be permitted in any room in the hotel assigned to Key Clubbers of the opposite sex unless a Key Club advisor is present. Public Displays of Affection are not allowed at any time.
11. Attendance at all sessions is mandatory for all Key Clubbers unless otherwise noted in the convention program.
12. Name tags and wristbands must be worn at all times during the convention.
13. Use of profane language, rude hand or arm gestures, or disrupted behaviors will not be tolerated at any time.
14. Use of tobacco products by any Key Clubber is not permitted at the convention.
15. All participants are expected to abide by the designated dress code for each session. "Professional" refers to dress shirt, slacks, necktie, sport or suit coat, and appropriate shoes for males, and dress or suit, shirt or slacks, blouse, and appropriate shoes for females. "Business Casual" refers to slacks, collared shirt, and appropriate shoes for males, and slacks skirt or skort, blouse or collared shirt, and appropriate shoes for females. "Casual" refers to shorts or jeans, collared shirts, sweatshirts, or appropriate tee shirts and casual footwear for males, and shorts, skort, or jeans, collared shirt, sweatshirt or appropriate tee shirt and casual footwear for females.
16. Violations of the Code of Conduct may result in a Key Club member being dismissed from the event, and may also include further disciplinary action from the member's home school and/or the respective State High School League. No person will be entitled to any refund or registration fees if dismissed from the convention for disciplinary reason. Anyone dismissed from the convention should understand that he or she must pay return expenses and that a letter will be sent to the parents, school principal and sponsoring Kiwanis Club. Lastly, any Key Clubber who receives a warning but continues to exhibit unacceptable behavior will be expelled from Key Club and will be banned from participation from any further District functions.
17. Each advisor is expected to review the Code of Conduct with the club members prior to arrival at the Fall Leadership Conference or the Spring District Convention. Ignorance of the above rules on the part of any Key Clubber or advisor will not result in leniency.



Key Club Awards

THE GOLD KEY AWARD - This is the highest award that can be given by the District to an adult who has made a significant contribution in Key Club. Nominations for this award must be in writing and sent to the Key Club District Administrator. The nomination will be submitted by the club presidents, Key Club members, Kiwanians, District Board members, advisors, or District Kiwanis committee members. Selection is based on service to the Minnesota-Dakotas District Key Club, and the final selection is made by the Key Club District Board Members. This is not necessarily an annual award. Any winners will be announced at the Governor's Banquet and will be presented the Gold Key plaque and pin.

OUTSTANDING DISTRICT BOARD MEMBER - Selection is made by District Governor and Administrator from amongst the members now serving on the Key Club District Board. Selection is based on the greatest contribution to the Board and Key Club in general. Winners will be announced at the Sunday Recognition Session and will be presented by the Governor and Administrator.

SANDY NININGER MEDAL - This Key Club International Award was named after the first American soldier to receive the Congressional Medal of Honor during the Second World War. Sandy Nininger was a Key Clubber prior to going to West Point and becoming a lieutenant in the United States Army. The award may be presented to any Key Clubber demonstrating outstanding contributions to his or her school, community, and club. Nominations must be made in writing and sent to the Key Club District Administrator. Nominations may be made by any club president, Key Club member, advisor, or Kiwanis District Committee members. Final selection will be made by the Key Club District Board, and the winner or winners will be announced at the Governor's Banquet.

THE TOM P. HORAN DISTINGUISHED KEY CLUB MEMBER - This award is to recognize a special member in each region who goes above and beyond the call of duty.

SPECIAL AWARDS - The Key Club District Board has the authority to present other suitable awards to any individual or group that the Board feels is deserving of recognition. Some of the District Special Awards include: Club Officer Recognition, Faculty and Kiwanis Advisor Recognition, Club Newsletter, Club Article Award, Theme Participation, Rookie of the Year, and Club Service

"CRZY" MARY BOWEN CREATIVITY IN LEADERSHIP AWARD: There are very few people in this world that selflessly throw themselves into their work the way our Crzy Mary does. She works endlessly to better our organization. She is truly an inspiration to Key Club members and adults alike. It is because of her tireless efforts, enthusiasm, and creativity that we have created this award to be given to adults who go above and beyond in inspiring others to join Kiwanis, work with Key Clubs, go crazy in front of others, and motivate students to join Key Club.

Key Club Contests

ACHIEVEMENT - Each Key Club must enter this contest on the official form sent in the Convention mailing in order for the club's delegates to vote in the House of Delegates. Judges will select the winners in each section - Platinum, Gold, Silver, and Bronze.

SINGLE SERVICE - Each Key Club may enter this contest using the forms sent in the Convention mailing. Judges will determine the three from all clubs entered. Judging is based on the outstanding single service projects undertaken by clubs during the year.

MAJOR EMPHASIS PROGRAM - Each club may enter this contest using the forms sent in the spring mailing. Judges will award the top three Key Clubs which, through its unselfish efforts, has produced the best Major Emphasis Projects.

DISTRICT THEME - This award is given to the top three Key Clubs who best portray a project or activity that deals with the theme chosen by the Key Club District Board. The Key Club District Board will vote on these awards while at the Convention.

ORATORICAL - Any Key Clubber may enter this contest. Each orator will be allowed no more than five minutes for the presentation. The subject is the International Theme. The top three orators will be recognized at the Governor's Banquet, and the winning orator will be asked to deliver his or her oration at the Banquet.

INTERNATIONAL POSTER - Any Key Club may participate in this contest. The poster should be designed to recruit new members for Key Club, and should not be designed to represent the District Theme of the current Key Club year.

INTERNATIONAL VIDEO - The video must be produced by club members at a cost not to exceed \$250 USD, and should be submitted on a DVD. The length of the completed video segment should be either 30 or 60 seconds. The video should also be promotional for Key Club as an organization and/or the Key Club within its respective school/community.

TRADITIONAL SCRAPBOOK - A Key Club may enter a scrapbook containing pictures, souvenirs, examples, newspaper clippings, etc. of its activities during the club administrative year.

NON-TRADITIONAL SCRAPBOOK - A Key Club may enter a non-traditional scrapbook or composition of other media containing pictures, souvenirs, examples, newspaper clippings, or other representations of its activities during the club administrative year.

SPIRIT AWARD - The spirit award this year is a gold duck. Ways to show spirit can be cheering, participating in the supply drives, and much more.

REGIONAL SPIRIT AWARD - This award is bestowed upon the region with the most spirit and creativity.
